# MAYOR'S MESSAGE (CONTINUED)



Once again, I'm very pleased to announce our city our has achieved another winning grant. We received \$186,000 towards our new splash pad that is under construction at Calvin Park as part of the Phase 2 Cuyahoga County District 6 ARPA funds. These funds were awarded through a process where our application was scored against 14 other projects competing for the same funds. This bring our partnership, awards, grants and sponsorship total to almost \$7,000,000 since the start of 2020.

### **Noise restrictions**

The Seven Hills Police Department would like to remind all residents that summer is here which means nice weather, yard work and more people out and about in the neighborhoods. You may not know that while working in the yard there are some City Ordinances that limit the hours you can complete certain yard work or play loud music or create similar types of noise. Here are the hours that allow you to use different types of tools or play radios and other similar devices. The entire ordinances can be viewed on the city's website.

### C.O 555.03(k) Domestic power tools and Equipment

Monday - Friday 8:00 AM - 9:30 PM Saturday - Sunday 10:00 AM - 8:00 PM.

### C.O 555.03(g) Construction Equipment, Drilling or Demolition

Monday - Friday 7:30 AM - 9:00 PM Saturday - Sunday 9:00 AM - 8:00 PM

### C.O. 555.003(i) Radios, Televisions Sets, Musical Instruments and Similar Devices

Monday – Friday 8:00 AM – 9:00 PM Saturday – Sunday 9:00 AM – 8:00 PM

### Solicitors/Do Not Knock List

Also, the Seven Hills Police Department would like to remind residents that if you are on the do not knock list and unwanted solicitors are still knocking on your door that you should notify the Police Department immediately.

### **Underage Drinking Laws**

What parents should know:

As a parent, you cannot give alcohol to your teen's friends under the age of 21 under any circumstances, even in your own home, even with their parent's permission.

You cannot knowingly allow a person under 21, other than your own child, to remain n your home or on your property while consuming or possessing alcohol.

### If you break the law:

You can face a maximum sentence of six months in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.

Others can sue you if you give alcohol to anyone under 21, and they, in turn, hurt someone, hurt themselves or damage property.

Officers can take any alcohol, money, or property used in committing the offense.

### Things you can do as a parent:

- Refuse to supply alcohol to children.
- Be at home when your teen has a party.
- Make sure that alcohol is not brought into your home or property by your teen's friends.
- Talk to other parents about not providing alcohol at other events your child will be attending. Create alcohol free opportunities and activities in your home so teens will feel welcome.

Please review Chapter 529 of the Seven Hills Codified Ordinances for applicable liquor control offenses.

# FIRE DEPARTMENT-EMERGENCY: 9-1-1 FIRE NON-EMERGENCY: 216.524.3321



In 1986 the Northern Ohio Fire Fighters Association, the Northeast Ohio Fire Chief's Association, along with Metro Health Medical Center started the Aluminum Cans for Burned Children Foundation (ACBC) to help children who suffer severe burn injuries. The ACBC program pays for special medical equipment not normally covered by insurance to aid in the healing process. ACBC strives to meet the individual needs of the patients and provides rehabilitation, clothing, toys, games, computer and video equipment, and other miscellaneous items not covered by insurance.

Since 1988, burn survivors from age 5 to 16 have been able to enjoy a free, four-day retreat at Camp Phoenix. Camp Phoenix is held in the summer and winter at Camp Cheerful in Strongsville, Ohio. The camp experience brings together some fifty burned children to enjoy a fun, therapeutic camping experience with others who have suffered similar injuries. The aim is to create a secure environment providing an atmosphere to promote interaction and help the children to better cope with their injuries. They also hear from other burn survivors who have successfully recovered.

The ACBC program also offers a scholarship program open to any pediatric patient who has been an inpatient at the Burn Center. The program annually awards scholarships to qualified recipients at an accredited school or university.

The Seven Hills Fire Department is one of more than 85 fire stations in Northeast Ohio that participates in this program. We have a collection point behind our station for residents to drop off bags of aluminum cans. These cans are recycled and the proceeds help fund the different programs run by ACBC. Please consider this option for your recyclable cans!

**Sewer Backup** – on Weekends and after hours, please call Non-Emergency Dispatch at (216) 524-3911 and they will contact the Service Department to assist in any Flooding Emergency.



### Mailboxes

The Service Department will make repairs to mailboxes that have been damaged by snowplows. Typically, damage is a result of the snow hitting the mailbox and not direct contact with the plow. Please check the condition of your mailbox in preparation for snowfall. Call the Service Department to report an issue at 216-525-6225.

### Brush and Branch Collection

Branch chipping service will be the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of the Month. Place branches on the tree lawn for the Service Department to chip. Branch requirements are: Longer than 3' and no bigger than 10" in diameter. Place branches at the curb parallel with the roadway and the cut end going with traffic. Do Not bundle or tie. Chipping service is for Residents only – **No contractors.** Call the Service Department to schedule at 216 –525-6225.

**Water Main Breaks** - Should you notice bubbling or streaming water along the roadway or tree lawn, please call the Cleveland Water Department at 216-664-3060 to report the break.

**Street Light Outages** - To report a street light outage, broken fixture or light flickering please call The Illuminating Company at 1-888-544-4877 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225.

**Document Shredding** – The remaining shred date will be August 15<sup>th</sup> from 1PM-7PM behind City Hall. Documents will be shredded on site. This service is for Seven Hills residents only. No businesses. Residents of Seven Hills may bring their personal records, financial documents, letters, manila folders, ledgers, cancelled checks, old invoices and bills. Staples and paperclips do not need to be removed. No plastic, metal spirals, 3-ring binders, cardboard or magazines.

**Household Hazardous Waste & Computer Roundup** – The next roundup will be September 19th from 8AM to 6PM behind City Hall. **Tire Roundup –** You may drop off your car or light truck tires (20" or less) behind City Hall on **September 19**<sup>th</sup> from 8AM to 6PM. Scrap tires must be off the rim.

**Household Material Accepted -** Oil or solvent-based paint, sealers, primers, or coatings (aerosols or liquids) – varnishes, polyurethane, shellacs, paint thinner, mineral spirits, turpentine, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, caustic household cleaners, automotive fluid, motor oil, car batteries, adhesives, driveway sealer, kerosene, gasoline, lighter fluid, mercury.

**Materials Not Accepted -** Latex paint, explosives, gun powder, ammunition, flares, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, sharps, radioactive waste, florescent bulbs.

**Disposal of Latex Paint -** The Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District does not accept latex paint at the HHW roundup. Latex paint is comprised mostly of water and is not a hazardous material. To dispose of latex paint, solidify with sawdust or cat litter and place in your curbside trash. Remove the lid so trash crews know that it is solidified. **Computer Materials Accepted -** Computers, printers, cable boxes, calculators, toner, back up batteries, stereo systems, keyboards, mouse, cell phones, fax machines, power supplies, laptops, speakers, telephones network systems, circuit boards, modems, test equipment, cable, wire, hard drives, extension cords, copy machines VHS/DVD players, routers, switches, laptop batteries, LCD monitors, cameras, printer cartridges, typewriters, servers, CDROM/floppy drives, DVR recorder.



**Trash Pickup** - Schedule a bulk pickup by calling Waste Management at 866-797-9018 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225. Fabric furniture, mattresses and box springs MUST be wrapped in plastic. Carpet should be no longer than 4' bundled and tied. Limit 8 rolls per week.

Four (4) additional bags or cans (35-gallon, 40 pound limit), allowed outside the cart. Bags or cans may be filled with trash, yard waste or construction debris. ONLY 4 Allowed.

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# ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

### 2023 Pavement Rehabilitation Program

The 2023 Pavement Rehabilitation Program includes the following streets: St. Francis Drive, Greenlawn Drive, Somerset Lane, Bryant Lane, Justo Lane, E. Parkhaven Drive, Jasmine Drive, Cricket Lane (portion), S. Cricket Lane, Lotus Lane and Applewood Drive (portion). Work will continue through the summer with completion of September 1, 2023.

# 2023 Pavement Markings Program

The 2023 Pavement Markings Program refreshes the street striping throughout the City, and will begin after the City has finished performing crack sealing and pavement rejuvenation on the City streets in early Summer.

# Calvin Park Drainage Improvements (Phase 2)

This project will improve the functionality of this vital stormwater management system. Repairs to approximately 500 linear feet of stream channel to prevent erosion, as well as removal of accumulated sediment to restore storage capacity, commence in mid May with a completion of September 1, 2023. Additional plantings will occur in November 2023.

The Engineering Department plans to go out for public bid on the following projects this year:

### **Skyview Drive Watermain Replacement**

This project was awarded by the Cleveland Water Department in late 2022. Design is underway and the cost of the project will be funded by Cleveland Water Department.

The City has been awarded another watermain replacement project by the Cleveland Water Department in Spring 2023. The City has 3 years to complete this project, and all costs are covered by Cleveland Water Department.

Throughout any given year, the Engineering Department receives applications from various entities (cable, phone, gas, and electric) to improve their facilities. These improvements may be above ground or below ground, or a combination of the two. In any case, an application for permit is reviewed by the Engineering Department for these entities to perform the work within the City's public right of way or within an easement designated for the utility. Certain conditions are stipulated upon issuing a permit, some of which include fully restoring any disturbed areas after construction is completed. As a condition of issuing a permit, each contractor has to be licensed AND bonded with the City in an amount of \$50,000 to ensure that compliance to the conditions is attained.

If there is such a project in your area, you may contact the Engineering Department to learn more as indicated below.

The City partners with the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORSD) and Cuyahoga Soil & Water Conservation District (CSWCD) to assist with the management of stormwater in our City. ## Roads

The following roadways in Ward 2 are getting resurfaced this year:

- 1. St. Francis Drive
- 2. Greenlawn Drive
- 3. Somerset Lane

Bryant Lane has significant deterioration to the base and curbs, and that road will be completely rebuilt.



### Taxes

Like you, I pay my share of taxes and it can be a burden, but necessary. Did you know that for every tax dollar you and I pay in property taxes, **only 12 cents is collected by the City of Seven Hills?** The rest of the tax collections go to the county (24 cents), and to the Parma School district at (64 cents). So...it is crucial that those 12 cents from each tax dollar collected by the city are used effectively and efficiently.

How do we do that? The mayor and city council approve reasonable budgets to get the city's business done effectively. More importantly, how do we make our local dollars go further? The Seven Hills Mayor and his administration have aggressively obtained more grant money in the past three years than at any other time in the city's history.

Grants and rewards = \$3,563,941

Partnerships = \$3,153,259

Sponsorships = \$201,500



Add the savings achieved through additional joint partnerships with other communities doing roadway work along with partnerships with local businesses, and it is apparent that our tax dollars are working overtime! So much so, that there has not been a net tax increase over the past 7 years.

# Investing in the Future...\$\$\$

The good news is that not only does the city have a balanced budget, but that the city is putting money in the bank over the past several years. The city is very much financially healthy to the tune of \$19 million of unexpended monies in the bank as compared to \$3.1 million in 2017. A large portion of this money is generating interest (currently at 4.76%) to help fund future projects and to minimize the need to ask for additional property taxes from you and my family. Being fiscally proactive keeps our city financially secure.

All of that hard work, reorganizing, streamlining, and just being fiscally savvy by the administration (in cooperation with the city council) has resulted in the city banking \$1,100,000 dollars in surplus last year. This surplus will allow continued improvements of the city's infrastructure (think: roads, sewer, drainage) and equipment needs going forward. **The city must continue to invest in its future**.

The city cannot fix every problem that was ignored over the past 30 years in one, two or three years, but there is a firm plan to continue to build on our city's recent success and good management. The city has high quality roadways, police protection, fire and paramedic protection, parks and recreation, leaf pickup, and snow plowing.

We as a city are doing well. We are also poised for continued success. Please know you can contact me with questions related to city matters. # **HISTORY OF HOME DAYS IN AMERICA**

"Old Home Week" originated in the New England region of America, similar to a holiday or festival. In its beginning in the 19th Century, it involved a community effort to invite former residents of a village, town, or city; usually individuals who grew up in the community as children and moved elsewhere in adulthood... to visit their old house and home town.

In the late 20th and early 21st centuries, the practice spread to ither parts of America and has become a broader celebration with the emphasis on local culture and history, including the gathering of residents, old and new, to the celebration with Fun, Food, and Rides!

# **Group Descriptions**

- Cuttlefish: For ages 6 months to 3 years, the parent/guardian and participant will participate together in fun activities to help your child adjust to the water.
- Newt (Pre-School #1): For ages 3 and up, the goal of this group is to have the child learn to use their arms and legs with a floatation device, enter/exit the pool independently, and float, jump in, and exit the pool with or without assistance.
- Salamander (Preschool #2): For ages 3 and up, the goal of this group is to have the child improve their arm and leg strength, and float, jump in, and exit the pool with very little or without assistance.
- **Seahorse** (**Preschool #3**): For ages 3 and up, the goal of this group is to the float, jump in, and swim with their face in to the instructor without assistance.
- **Sea Dragon (Preschool #4):** For ages 4 to 7, the goal of this group is to improve on swimming skills, incorporate rhythmic breathing, and swimming farther than the previous levels.
- **Jellyfish** (Level #1): For ages 5 and up, the goal of this group is learn freestyle with rotary breathing and backstroke without assistance.
- **Sea Lion (Level #2):** For ages 5 and up, the goal of this group is improve on their freestyle swimming and swim backstroke farther with their body at the surface.
- Otter (Level #3): For ages 5 and up, this group is to improve freestyle and backstroke swimming and introduce breaststroke.
- **Polar Bear (Level #4):**For ages 5 and up, this group will improve technique, strength, endurance with freestyle, backstroke, and breaststroke, and introduce butterfly.
