A Message from Mayor Tony Biasiotta -

Dear Residents,

Welcome to the Spring edition of our quarterly newsletter. To get things started, I will paraphrase a popular George Orwell quote "The point is that the pleasures of spring are available to everybody, and cost nothing..."

After a full year of COVID changes and cancellations, we are getting back into the full swing of things (pun intended). The Seven Hills Baseball Federation is moving forward with the 2021 season. The City will be hosting Opening Day ceremonies at Calvin Park on Saturday June 5th, festivities will kick off at noon.

Our traditional Memorial Day Parade is scheduled for Monday May 31st at 10:30 a.m. Please join us along the parade route from St. Columbkille Church to Seven Hills City Hall, followed by our Memorial Day Ceremony.



Set aside the following dates: Friday August 27th – Sunday August 29th for the 2021 Home Days. We will have a special newsletter detailing all the entertainment and events that we have lined up.

I want you to know that we finished the year with over <u>\$1.4 million</u> in surplus general fund revenue! (Expense cuts plus federal and state COVID aid more than completely offset COVID impacts like increased cleaning expenses, the state mandated closure of the recreation center and the cancellation of other fee generating programs).

The 2020 surplus continues a 3-year trend of building our cash reserves and carefully setting aside funds for our upcoming infrastructure projects. For example, we closed 2020 by increasing our Capital Fund from a zero balance to \$902,000.

Our City finances have dramatically improved over the last 3 years. Our General Fund Unexpended (Cash) Balance (see the chart below).

We have also started 2021 trending in the right direction. Revenue is slightly up while General Fund expenses remain flat.

What does this all mean? Your City leaders have continued to carefully manage your tax dollars over the last few years. We are well-positioned to safely take on necessary large street and sewer projects.

However, we are not resting on our accomplishments. We are pressing ever harder on our Partnerships and Progress goals to ensure we bring the best value to our residents.

In fact, the uncertain economic environment has made the **partnerships** even more important. Below are just a few updates to the long list we shared in our winter newsletter:

Resurfacing of Chestnut Road is partly due to our being approved for funds through the County 50/50 program. The City will get the maximum \$250,000 allowed under the program towards this project.

We will be receiving \$75,000 from the State Capital Budget towards new ADA compliant restrooms and a concession stand for Calvin Park. We are not stopping with this great news. We have applied through the county block grant program for an additional \$150,000 towards Calvin Park improvements.

In addition, we have received a \$15,000 grant from Cuyahoga County Department of Disabilities for specialized programming, as well as building updates at our Recreation Center.

Lastly, we utilized approximately \$92,000 of a NOPEC energy grant towards replacing the old ballfield lights at <u>Valleywood Park</u>. The new LED lighting will create a safer playing field with significant maintenance and energy savings going forward. The City's contribution was approximately \$38,000, clearly showing how partnerships can bring great value to the table. The new lighting is expected to be ready for the 2021 baseball season.

Economic development: This spring we will witness two major milestones. First, the groundbreaking of the new regional headquarters of Erie Bank on April 7th at 11:30am. Second, the much-anticipated grand opening Meijer! The first Meijer in all of Cuyahoga County.

This May 4, 2021 is our Primary Election. The City of Seven Hills has one issue on ballot, **Issue 6.** Issue 6 is a renewal (**No Increase in Tax**) of our Fire Levy. The City will be sending out a flyer with specific information related to the levy and our Fire Department in general.

Also, on the ballot is Issue 10, the proposed bond issue and tax levy proposed by the Parma City School district.



Looking ahead to Spring/Summer 2021, you will see robust infrastructure activity, economic development and not only the return, but also the addition of, new community events (as soon as it safe to do so).

Please stay in touch. Much exciting news is on the horizon!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM FIRE CHIEF MEKLEMBURG:



Issue 6 – Five-year Fire Levy RENEWAL

In May the residents of Seven Hills will be asked to vote on a 5-year renewal for our Fire Tax Levy. This renewal will cost a \$100,000 homeowner \$176.40 per year in property tax. This is a renewal levy, which means there will be **no increase** in what is currently being paid for fire and EMS services in the City of Seven Hills.

The money produced from this levy helps pay for the salaries of five part-time firefighters 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It also helps maintain and upgrade equipment that we use to help serve the residents of Seven Hills. Some different services that we provide, such as, child car seat installation, our residential knox-box program, fire prevention, our Adopt A Hydrant program and other public education initiatives would not be possible without this Levy.

With the continuing development of the City of Seven Hills we hope to continue providing the level of fire and EMS protection that our residents and business partners have grown to expect.

HOW TO AVOID TELEPHONE SCAMS

Your personal information is important! Guard your social security number, your bank account and credit card number, and your driver's license or state identification number. Some criminals trick you on telephone calls to get your personal information. The criminals can then take your information and use your credit cards and bank accounts or open new ones. A real bank or credit card company will never call you and ask for your

social security or bank account numbers.

HOW TO AVOID TELEPHONE FRAUD

- 1. Donate only to recognized charities. Ask the caller to send more information.
- 2. Reject high pressure sales methods. Ask the caller to send more information.
- 3. Do not do business with anyone who offers to send a delivery service to collect your donation or payment for something you have not yet ordered or received.
- 4. Be careful making a donation or buying a service in exchange for the promise of a guaranteed sweepstakes winning.

Be careful of phone calls or emails saying that a friend or relative is in a faraway place and needs money to help him. This is a scam. Check with the friend or relative first before sending money.



HOW TO AVOID PRIZE AND SWEEPSTAKES FRAUD

- 1. If something sound too good to be true, it probably is!
- 2. Do not pay to collect sweepstakes winnings.
- 3. Phone numbers can be changed on caller ID so that con artists can trick you about who or where they are.

Ignore all phone solicitations to play a foreign lottery. Such sales and purchases are against the law.

SOLICITORS

The Seven Hills Police Department would like to remind residents that if you are on the do not knock list and unwanted solicitors are still knocking on your door that you should notify the Police Department immediately.

Although many solicitors register with the City, there are several that do not. We want to hear from our residents when anyone approaches their homes without a solicitor's permit.

ALWAYS, ask to see a solicitor's permit or proper identification. If they refuse or do not show you adequate identification, contact the Seven Hills Police Department at 216-524-3911 with a description and an officer will respond.

Flooding Emergency – on Weekends and after hours, please call Non-Emergency Dispatch at (216) 524-3911 and they will contact the Service Department to assist in any Flooding Emergency.

Mailboxes

The Service Department will make repairs to mailboxes that have been damaged by snowplows. Typically, damage is a result of the snow hitting the mailbox and not direct contact with the plow. Please check the condition of your mailbox in preparation for snowfall. Call the Service Department to report an issue at 216-525-6225.

Brush and Branch Collection

Place branches on the tree lawn for the City to chip. No need to bundle or tie. Call the Service Department to schedule at 216-525-6225.

Water Main Breaks - Should you notice bubbling or streaming water along the roadway or tree lawn, please call the Cleveland Water Department at 216-664-3060 to report the break.

Street Light Outages - To report a street light outage, broken fixture or light flickering please call The Illuminating Company at 1-888-544-4877 or the Service Department at 216-525-6225.

Document Shredding – The City will have three Document shred dates this year. April 20th, June 15th and August 17th from 1PM-7PM behind City Hall. Documents will be shredded on site. This service is for Seven Hills residents only. No business's. Residents of Seven Hills may bring their personal records, financial documents, letters, manila folders, ledgers, cancelled checks, old invoices and bills. Staples and paperclips do not need to be removed. No plastic, metal spirals, 3-ring binders, cardboard or magazines.

Household Hazardous Waste & Computer Roundup - Two roundup dates this year are May 18th and September 14th from 8AM to 6PM behind City Hall. For more information please check the Cuyahoga county solid waste district website: www.cuyahogarecycles.org/seven-hills

Household Material Accepted - Oil or solvent-based paint, sealers, primers, or coatings (aerosols or liquids) – varnishes, polyurethane, shellacs, paint thinner, mineral spirits, turpentine, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, caustic household cleaners, automotive fluid, motor oil, car batteries, adhesives, driveway sealer, kerosene, gasoline, lighter fluid, mercury.

Materials Not Accepted - Latex paint, explosives, gun powder, ammunition, flares, medical waste, pharmaceuticals, sharps, radioactive waste, florescent bulbs.

Disposal of Latex Paint - The Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District does not accept latex paint at the HHW roundup. Latex paint is comprised mostly of water and is not a hazardous material. To dispose of latex paint, solidify with sawdust or cat litter and place in your curbside trash. Remove the lid so trash crews know that it is solidified. Computer Materials Accepted - Computers, printers, cable boxes, calculators, toner, back up batteries, stereo systems, keyboards, mouse, cell phones, fax machines, power supplies, laptops, speakers, telephones network systems, circuit boards, modems, test equipment, cable, wire, hard drives, extension cords, copy machines VHS/DVD players, routers, switches, laptop batteries, LCD monitors, cameras, printer cartridges, typewriters, servers, CDROM/floppy drives, DVR recorder.

Simple Recycling – Orange bag curb side collection of clothing and home goods. All Simple Recycling collection operations are temporarily suspended. This will remain in effect until further notice. Check the City web-site for updates or call the Service Department at 216-525-6225. This is for orange bag curb side collection of clothing and home goods.



ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

Here is a listing of some long-standing public improvement projects, upcoming projects, and some important information:

Hemlock Creek Watershed Utility Improvement Project For property owners who have <u>not</u> yet connected their homes to the new sanitary sewer, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health will be mailing you a second notice letter containing specific information and requirements sometime in the near future._As a reminder, the information packet ("SANITARY SEWER - SERVICE LINE INSTALLATION INFORMATION") provided at the February 29, 2020 meeting is available online at http://www.sevenhillsohio.org/en-US/Hemlock-Creek.aspx. Since this packet provides permit requirements and details, you are encouraged to let your Contractor know that the information packets are available online. At this time, your City-registered Contractor can apply for the required City Building Permit. Please note, final assessment costs are currently being calculated and finalized. Final assessment costs will be available in the near future.

Broadview Road Traffic Signal (for new Meijer Project) This project is nearing completion and the new traffic signal will be installed in the next few weeks. For a 3-week period **before** the traffic light is fully functioning and is operational, the travelling public will be made aware via required road signage, along Broadview Road both Northbound and Southbound, that a new traffic signal will soon be in operation. Final Completion for construction is anticipated in March 2021.

2020/2021 Sewer Rehabilitation – Bayberry Area The Engineering Department has solicitated for public bids for this Project. The Engineer's Estimated Cost for Construction for the Project is \$348,249.00, and the lowest & best bid was awarded to *Insight Pipe Contracting, LLC* in the amount of \$290,802.55. There will be no major construction being performed that would affect vehicular traffic and/or general disturbances for the residents along the 8 streets (Waxberry Drive, Driftwood Drive, Bittersweet Drive, Panorama Drive, Firethorn Drive, Primrose Drive, Bayberry Drive, and Tanglewood Drive). Work is anticipated to last up to 180 days. Further information & notification will be provided to residents on the 8 streets by the Contractor performing the work. The City is utilizing Community Cost Share funds (available from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District) in the amount of \$115,000 to help offset the cost of the project. Work will commence within the next 60 days.

2021 City Road Program The following 12 streets will be part of the 2021 City Road Program: Elmhurst Drive (East Pleasant Valley to Evelyn), Summitview Drive, East Clearview Avenue, East Decker Drive (Northview to East Dartmoor), East Hillsdale Avenue (West 9th to Northview), Glenella Drive, Jasmine Drive (H.N. 2938 to western terminus), Karen Drive, South Main Hill Drive, Tanglewood Lane, Chestnut Road and Seven Hills Boulevard. Also included in the 2021 Road Program is the City-owned parking lot located at the Northeast corner of the Broadview Road / Hillside Road intersection where a new gazebo will be built this year. The Engineering Department is currently preparing the design and bid specifications for the 2021 City Road Program with anticipation of publicly bidding the Project in early March 2021. Construction is planned to commence in May/June 2021.

<u>Cheryl Ann Drive Culvert Improvements</u> The Cheryl Ann Drive Culvert plans and specifications are complete, and the project is out for public bid to rehabilitate the existing 108-inch storm sewer culvert pipe that crosses under Cheryl Ann Drive. The estimated cost of construction is \$351,270. The City plans to utilize Community Cost Share funds from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District of approximately \$175,000 to help offset the cost of the project. Construction is scheduled to commence in mid-to-late Spring 2021.

2021 City Crack-seal & Street Striping Programs The Engineering Department is preparing the bid documents for the annual street crack-seal program and the annual street striping program. It is anticipated to be publicly bid in March 2021, with construction to commence in Spring/Summer 2021.

Master Rain Gardener Class Spring 2021

When: April 26 through June 04 from 10:00am - 2:00pm

Learn to design, dig and plant your own rain garden!! Share your knowledge and become your community's expert on rain gardens. At the end of this 5-session course, you will become a Master Rain Gardener! Rain gardens capture and soak in rainwater that runs off hard surfaces like roofs and driveways while filtering pollutants that would otherwise flow to our storm drains and into our creeks and streams. You must attend all 5 classes, and build a rain garden to earn the Master Rain Gardener certification.

Hello Ward 3 Families:

This is the time of the year that takes me back to my childhood hearing one of my father's favorite saying, "I can hear the crocuses churning underground just pushing to break through the frozen surface." My hope is the crocuses are blooming and the daffodils are just starting to come up around your neighborhood.

As the weather breaks, it is such a nice feeling to get out and about catching up with our neighbors. The hope for 2021 is to once again be able to visit with each other at our summer civic events. The city is tentatively planning for the Memorial Day activities, followed by our long-standing Home Days tradition happening later this summer.

I am pleased to see progress with the Water Management Task Force Capital Improvements. These are required improvements due to decades of wear and tear. The City had made improvements to the system in 2020 with much more to come over the next year or so. However, I'm pleased that Ward 3 is receiving much attention in the first round of upgrades, such as the 4 additional basins added to Donna Rae last year.

Ward 3's Cheryl Ann Culvert, which is seriously deteriorating, will be replaced later this spring. The Cresthill Drive area will be investigated further, using a flow monitoring system, which will provide data on how to improve drainage issues for the Hemlock Creek Basin, that includes the streets of Hickory and Cricket.

On the fringe of the Ward, the Calvin Park retention basin will be dredged. Additionally, in partnership with the Sewer District, work continues to restore the floodplain of Hemlock Creek.

There are more capital improvement and economic development projects occurring in the City now than at any other time in my years of public service. Exciting times.

Have a great Spring. Stay healthy and take care of each other.

WARD 4 UPDATE

This has been a momentous time in the history of Seven Hills. While we have all struggled with the effects and consequences of COVID-19, Seven Hills residents have nonetheless again demonstrated our resilience and ability to overcome adversity. Not only have you surmounted these challenges, but we have excelled in advancing the interests of our city.

Our General Fund balance is increasing again. New investments and projects are here or on the horizon, and the welfare of our residents has been improved as a result. A new road program is under consideration as well, with more to come on these and other developments in the weeks and months ahead.

The new Meijer center will be open soon, Erie Bank is moving its regional headquarters here, and new upgrades to our parks, playgrounds, and athletic fields are coming, together with new amenities such as the gazebo at Hillside and Broadview Roads—all thanks to your support, the contributions of Meijer and other Seven Hills businesses, as well as the proactive efforts of the Biasiotta Administration. After years of coping with the well-publicized controversies of the past, your city hall is now progressing smartly as we approach the first quarter mark of the 21st century. Once the COVID virus has been defeated, Seven Hills is positioned to flourish as never before.

When we are gone, we leave nothing behind but what we have done for our neighbors and the love of our families. I am grateful to have been a small part of all this, and for the trust you have placed in me as your council representative. Working for my home town has been one of the proudest facets of my life.

Ward 4 is experiencing some other developments and issues which have lead to a number of resident questions. I am looking into these matters with the Administration and hope to report back once more information becomes available.

The first matter is whether the city should pursue street lighting for its major roads, including those in Ward 4. The Administration has contacted First Energy for information on this. Most of those major roads are either state highways or county roads, so there are some overlapping jurisdictional considerations.

Secondly, Ward 4 residents likely received a letter from the county recently, regarding a change in our polling location. This correlates with a proposed expansion of the church near Evelyn and Elmhurst. I and Council President Kelly opposed a variance for this expansion, and several residents have raised questions as to whether the neighborhood can sustain the increased traffic load. In the coming months, I will ask that the City Planning Commission pay particular attention to these concerns to help protect the residential character of this neighborhood.

The third matter is the county's proposed bike-hike trail on land along the high tension lines paralleling Magnolia, to be built under the direction of the West Creek Conservancy. This long-standing project is moving forward after the final parcels of land were acquired by the Conservancy to connect this path through Independence to the National Park canal path. Residents are rightly concerned with the possibility of reduced privacy and security in their back yards. The Administration has raised these questions with the West Creek Conservancy and county.

Fourth, is the-city-wide question whether raising chickens should be permitted in the city and under what conditions. A proposed ordinance has been moved out of committee and to the full council for consideration. Those who have an opinion either way on the subject should contact their representatives as the issue is debated.

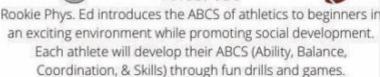

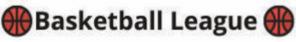
