## **APPOINTMENTS AND CONFIRMATIONS**

**Mayor Dell'Aquila** stated that he would like to nominate **Jeff Bryda** to fill the vacancy on the Planning Commission.

**MOTION** by Mr. Leech, seconded by Mr. Barth, to confirm and accept the appointment of **Jeff Bryda** to the position of **Member of the Planning Commission**, through the duration of the current term.

**Mr. Trafis** stated:

“I’m looking for my notes real quick. Does anybody else have any discussion as I look for my notes?”

**Mr. Snitzky** stated:

“Yes, I do. I’ve known Jeff a while. I had the privilege of sitting next to him at Council. He has a great understanding of engineering and construction and concrete work and things like that, and I think that he would be an asset to the Planning Commission.”

**Mr. Trafis** stated:

“Okay. Madam President, I’m sorry – thank you for your patience. We have one vacancy on the Planning Commission from when Joe Tripi, Jr. resigned, I’d say approximately four months ago, because he was running for City Council at the time. My question is why is this appointment coming to us now, and why didn’t it come to us shortly after Mr. Tripi had resigned from it?”

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**Mr. Trafis** (continued):

“Now we’re sitting one month away from a new City Council with a completely new dynamic who may or may not support the Mayor’s appointment, and I believe that this is nothing but a political move that is circumventing the real process, and this appointment should be held until the new Council takes office. Now, I will be voting ‘no’ on this appointment because when Mr. Bryda was Councilman in Ward 1, he certainly did not represent the desires of the people in Ward 1 in regard to any vote that happened with the Planning Commission. He voted to uphold every recommendation, and he certainly was not representing what our residents wanted. Thank you.”

**Mr. Leech** stated:

“I believe Jeff Bryda is a good and decent man, and I believe that he’s very qualified because of the business end of it that he’s been in outside of the City. I will be voting in the positive.”

**Mr. Barth** stated:

“I know Jeff is a man of conviction, and as Tom said, he is well qualified to sit on that seat.”

**Mr. Fraundorf** stated:

“I’d just like to say that I agree with Matt. I think that this should be a decision that is made by the incoming Council in thirty days.”

**Council President Ernst** stated:

“And this Council is still sitting, so I will chime in and say that we still have the right to make appointments for this month. The Mayor spoke at Caucus and said that he had talked to a number of people and had not been able to find anybody to fill this, which is why it has taken some time.”

**Mr. Trafis** added:

“Ironically, today, I received a call from a Ward 4 resident who told me that they are interested in getting involved and contacted the Mayor about a Planning Commission seat and got no response. So there is another candidate out there that is willing to get involved, and if you want to table this tonight, I’d be happy to connect the Mayor with this resident. I literally just found out about this around.....I don’t know.....3:00 today.”

**Council President Ernst** added:

“I think that Jeff would be a good candidate for the Planning Commission. We have support here.”

**Mr. Trafis** continued:

“Why not interview another candidate? Maybe he’d bring something different to the table.”

*At this point in the meeting, three audience members vocally indicated their interest in the vacant Planning Commission position.*

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**Council President Ernst** asked the Clerk of Council to call roll on the pending floor motion.

## **COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS, AND CLAIMS**

The Clerk of Council stated she would also like to acknowledge a letter addressed to Captain Joe Lecznar of the Seven Hills Fire Department, from the members of the Next Chapter Book Club, Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities, dated October 8, 2015, as follows:

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“To Captain Joe and the Firemen of Seven Hills Fire Department. On August 11, 2015 the Next Chapter Book Club from Southwest Adults Activity Center visited the Seven Hills Fire Station after we completed a book about the job of firemen. We truly enjoyed our visit and wish to thank you for the following opportunities: (1) We were able to tour the big station and see all the equipment that the firemen use. (2) We had a chance to ask questions and were given lessons on fire safety and how to make emergency calls. (3) We got to see inside the big firetrucks and the ambulance. (4) An emergency call came in, and we got to watch an ambulance leave to help someone in need. (5) We watched how a fireman dresses for a fire and we learned about the training to become a fireman. (6) We learned that firemen will assist other fire departments when there is a need for more help. (7) We saw a wrecked car and learned that firemen have to practice to get someone out of a car in a bad accident. (8) We liked the Fire Dog statue in front of the building. (9) We each received a fire hat, badge, and a pencil. (10) We had our picture taken with Captain Joe. We thank you for such a wonderful visit! We had a great time!”

## **COUNCIL OPEN TO THE AUDIENCE ON LEGISLATION ONLY**

**Tom Jaros, 224 Crescent Ridge Drive**, made the following comments:

“Hundreds of residents – Ward 1 and Ward 2 – asked that the Planning Commission, in its entirety, be suspended because of their lack of due diligence on the rezoning for the Elderly Care District, and for the subsequent actions on John Glenn, and the lack of due diligence there. And the fact that you guys are worried about repopulating a seat that sat vacant all this time so that Mr. Bryda can fill this seat now before the new Council comes in – I agree with Mr. Trafis and Mr. Fraundorf. This stinks, it’s terrible. The Planning Commission stinks – the Planning Commission needs to be restaffed in its entirety, Mr. Mayor. I don’t know what you’re doing here. But you’re certainly not representing.....you saw hundreds of people here asking that those guys be removed because of their lack of due diligence. And you’re just moving ahead like nothing happened. This is wrong. This is not representation of the people. That’s all. Thank you.”

**Council President Ernst** thanked Mr. Jaros for his comments.

**Mr. Leech** asked if there will be a Public Hearing at the next Council Meeting for Resolution No. 19-2015.

**Council President Ernst** answered that a Public Hearing is not required for a lot split request.

**Mr. Leech** replied, “Okay, thank you.”

**Resolution No. 20-2015** – A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF SEVEN HILLS, THE QUESTION OF COUNCIL AMENDING SECTION 505.11, HUNTING PROHIBITED, AS FOUND IN CHAPTER 505, ANIMALS AND FOWL, AS CONTAINED IN PART FIVE, GENERAL OFFENSES CODE, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SEVEN HILLS, TO AUTHORIZE A NUISANCE ABATEMENT INITIATIVE FOR BOTH SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM CONTROL AND REDUCTION OF THE WHITE-TAILED DEER POPULATION, IN COORDINATION WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONTIGUOUS, ADJOINING, POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS THAT OPT TO ADOPT A SIMILAR PLAN FOR NUISANCE ABATEMENT, AND ESTABLISHING AN ELECTION DATE THEREFOR.

## **COUNCIL OPEN TO THE AUDIENCE**

**Lucy McKernan, 755 Hillside Road**, made the following comments:

“Good evening, Council. All right, in regard to – I can’t tell if it’s 20-2015 or 120-2015, I’m sorry – the one that you just read about the deer, I would like to say, first of all, I find this funny. Nobody really wants this, and yet we’re all here.”

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**Lucy McKernan** (continued):

“First of all, I find the language in the Resolution biased. Words like ‘unmanageable’, ‘great financial loss’, ‘increase annually’, ‘exploding’, ‘urgent’, and then the conflict between the words ‘liberal’ and ‘limited’ in regard to hunting – is it liberal, or is it limited? So, number one, the safety issue. I have right here – I went through each and every deer vehicle crash in Seven Hills, as well as the surrounding communities, spanning six years. There has not been one human fatality or injury in Seven Hills. Therefore, no threat to public safety. No threat to public health. I called the County Board of Health on October 29<sup>th</sup> -- no lyme disease. I checked with the Division of Wildlife in Ohio – no chronic wasting disease, no starving deer. Also, since there is no public threat to safety or health, what this is all about is browsing or nuisance. And what I want to know is who considers them a nuisance. Where is this silent majority? Because I don’t really hear from anybody on Council or the Mayor that they really want this. Deer vehicle accidents in Seven Hills or any other surrounding communities have not increased annually – they have actually decreased. No one in the world, in Seven Hills, in the Southwest suburbs of Cuyahoga County, or Cuyahoga County, has gone through each and every one of these deer vehicle crash records such as I have. Okay, there is no threat to human safety. Ohio Department of Public Safety said that there has been no human fatalities in Cuyahoga County related to deer vehicle crashes or DVC’s for over five years. So the question is, has there been a count? I hope you all have your pens out, because I want these questions answered. Where’s the count – is it an aerial or a ground count? What is the number of kills allowed? Why is one part of the Resolution worded as ‘limited’ hunting and another one as ‘liberal’? What are both short-term and long-term methods exactly? I want to know exactly what you mean by birth control and non-lethal. I don’t want these generic terms thrown around any more to fool the public. I would like to know if you’re talking about sterilization, GotoCon, PZP chemicals, surgical – what are you talking about here? And I would also like to finish up with one thought. It’s a very bad idea to put this on the ballot. I shared this with Mr. Barth last week. A lot of people don’t realize what happened in Solon. A ‘yes’ meant, yes – preserve the deer. And when voters went in, the Board of Elections had taken off the qualifying language at the bottom of the ballot, and the voters voted the wrong way inadvertently, and we lost 60-40. People didn’t want any killing in Solon, and they don’t want it here. So I would like to know who the hell these people are who think that the deer are a nuisance, when they are actually native to this area and they’re eating plants, and that’s what they’ve always done, it’s what they’re always going to do, and you know the science behind this, you know that rebound is an inevitability. So I want to know who the hell, politically, is behind this. Is it like Sam Alai, the hunter, who is the Mayor of Broadview Heights. Is it like Dan Kasaris on Council in North Royalton? So I’ve said what I have to say. I have all kinds of information here if anybody wants to look at it – for all of the communities – no threats to public safety. Therefore, this shouldn’t even be allowed on the ballot. Thank you, Council.”

**Council President Ernst** thanked Mrs. McKernan for her comments.

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**Ed McKenna, 1908 Ridgeview**, made the following comments:

“I wasn’t going to speak, but since Lucy asks a question. All my neighbors want it! I just want to thank Council for remembering we’re America and putting it on the ballot and letting the people decide. You’re doing the right thing, You’re not making the decision up here. You’re going to let the people decide and then you’re going to act accordingly. So it’s really going to answer. She wants to know who wants it. You guys put it on the ballot, and we’ll know. Thank you.”

**Council President Ernst** thanked Mr. McKenna for his comments.

**Ed Maslowski, 1035 Joy Oval**, made the following comments:

“I’m reading the Ordinance and I have a little problem with the ambiguity and some of the implications in it. Incidentally, I think it’s a good idea to do something about the deer, really, with all due respect. The population of deer in this area has gotten so bad that they’re clearly starving. They’re eating things that they never ate before. And I’ve seen deer that have been injured, walking around on broken legs, and it’s really kind of sad. So, there is a population problem. But, in the Ordinance, you talk about five contiguous acres, and it’s very unclear as to whether this constitutes more than one property. And if there is more than one property, is there a limit on a number of properties that can be combined to make up the five acres? Incidentally, five acres is a lot of area. Independence uses two acres for their ordinance, and they limit it to two adjacent properties. This Ordinance in this regard is very, very unclear. I don’t know if it’s a legal necessity to make ordinances ambiguous and unclear, or what. But I keep finding this in ordinances.”

**Council President Ernst** replied, “This was put together by the Law Directors of the multiple cities. These are the same ordinances for all the cities that were part of the Mayors’ Committee. So this was a group thing. I’m not going to get into a discussion as to whether it was.....”

**Mr. Maslowski** continued, “Well, Independence is not part of this because they already have their own ordinance. And it is a lot clearer. This is muddy.”

**Council President Ernst** stated, “No, Independence is not part of this. They are not. I understand, sir.”

**Mr. Maslowski** said, “I see this all the time in reading ordinances, and I don’t know.....I know that lawyers can write much better than that. I some times think they do it deliberately.”

**Council President Ernst** added, “It’s been worked on by the Law Directors of the group – the Mayors’ group. This was not just our Law Director. Thank you for your comments.”

**Mr. Maslowski** concluded, “They really should do a better job of being clear. Thank you.”

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**Rich Pagent, Meadview Drive**, made the following comments:

“I have a couple of questions that I’d like to clarify in my mind. Who determines when short and long-term controls have ended, and on what basis. Until the deer are completely eliminated, or until residents say enough is enough. On what basis is control stopped?”

**Council President Ernst** answered, “There will be a meeting next Monday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, at 6:00 p.m., just for deer questions. I don’t have the answer to that question.”

**Mr. Pagent** continued, “Well there has to be a stopping point. Otherwise, it would go on for year after year. Until some determination is made or some statistics are compiled – if that’s enough in that area. And what recourse do the property owners – next to the killing zone – what recourse do they have if they don’t want people using a long bow right next to them? What recourse do they have? I called.....last year I talked to someone in Independence or Brecksville.....because they have a similar 2 ½-acre quota. I asked what about the neighbor if they don’t want somebody right next to them using it. The answer I got was, well that’s too bad, it’s their property – they can do what they want on it. I hope that’s not the philosophy here.”

**Council President Ernst** replied, “This is a five acre parcel – it’s what is required by our ordinance.”

**Mr. Pagent** said, “I wouldn’t want someone using a long bow on property next to me.”

**Council President Ernst** said, “I understand, sir.”

**Mr. Pagent** continued, “Also, can the property owner of five acres make a profit by charging a fee to the shooters to use as platforms? This could be a nice little business in Seven Hills – a new added business. If not, what would prevent this? You have a property – you have a platform. If you want to charge people to come in and use it, is that legal? That’s nice to be in the newspapers. Seven Hills is selling property for shooters to come in. And who is going to oversee this operation? Who is going to see that the regulations and new laws are carried out?”

**Council President Ernst** answered, “The Division of Wildlife and our Police.”

**Mr. Pagent** continued, “And what if the State hunting laws are violated? Does the City have authority to enforce them? The State laws?”

**Council President Ernst** replied, “If the State laws are violated, that would be the Division of Wildlife I would think.”

**Mr. Pagent** asked, “Who is going to oversee the deer ordinance? Are we going to have a policeman there? Or just let them go on their own?”

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**Council President Ernst** answered, “The police. It will need to be approved by the police before they are allowed to set up for shooting.”

**Mr. Pagent** continued, “Well, these are some of the things I’m concerned about.”

**Council President Ernst** said, “You should come to next week’s meeting.”

**Mr. Pagent** said, “I think other people are concerned. There’s a lot of unanswered questions.”

**Council President Ernst** replied, “Then you should come to next week’s meeting – you can ask those questions.”

**Mr. Pagent** concluded, “Okay, thank you.”

**Tom Jaros, 224 Crescent Ridge Drive**, made the following comments:

“First of all, I’d like to congratulate the incoming people to Council. I’d like to congratulate the voters for finally neutering the wrecking machine. It’s been dragging this City down for over ten years. I congratulate Mr. Trafis for getting the most votes of the At-Large candidates. Mr. Barth, too bad you’re 800 behind. I don’t know why you guys – you just got a mandate – those of you that are outgoing – you just got a mandate from the people. They’re unhappy with what you’re doing. But now you’re going to hamstring the new Council people, who aren’t the Council people until December 4<sup>th</sup> – with personnel appointments. I don’t know why the Mayor had to ask for them right now to begin with, but I guess you guys don’t care because you’re going out. And you’ll probably never be back – we know Michele won’t. But hanging the incoming people with your choice in people – is that a nah-nah-nah to the voters – you voted me out so now I’m going to screw the new Council, or what? I don’t know what you guys are doing. I think it’s just nuts. Everybody talks about Seven Hills politics and the circus. You guys make the circus. This is like Barnum & Bailey – and the Mayor is leading them – and you’re the Big Top Announcer here. This is just obscene. You guys ought to stop. Thank you.”

**Council President Ernst** thanked Mr. Jaros for his comments.

**Bob Todd, 252 East Pleasant Valley Road**, made the following comments:

“From my understanding the Seven Hills Police may not be on board with hunting in Seven Hills. At the next meeting could we have access to the Seven Hills Police Department for their comments? I mean their opinion holds pretty strong – their experiences. After all, a long bow can be just as dangerous as a firearm, especially when it’s through your golden retriever. So if we can have access to the Seven Hills Police Department at the next meeting.....”

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**Council President Ernst** answered, “We can ask for a representative to be here at the meeting.”

**Mr. Todd** stated, “It could help, I’m sure. Thank you.”

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**Mr. Leech** (continued):

This undoubtedly will be my last Council Meeting due to my pending open heart surgery. I feel terrible that I can't fulfill my 19 weeks as the Ward 1 Councilman. I will be short, actually, three meetings – which is not so bad I guess. Sorry about that. I never quit anything in my life. And this is a first.

I did find out by announcing my medical problems, 90% of the people that heard about this said that they didn't care, and the other 10% were glad.....so I don't understand that.

Congratulations to all the candidates, including the ones who didn't qualify. You're all winners in my book. Gerry, Jr. – I like to call him that – yes!

**Mr. Trafis** said, "I get to talk after you, right?"

I didn't get the memo when the coronation is. I hope that comes out, okay. I know in the spirit of the holiday season you were smart enough to bring your turkey with you – sitting in the back row there – that's pretty good. I'm kidding, Gerry – I'm kidding. **Mrs. Sekerak** said, “That makes me older than dirt, too!”

Seriously, Council, I hope you weren't disappointed in selecting me to be a Rent-A-Councilman. I tried my darndest to bridge the gap, and after I recuperate I will always be available to help the City I love so much in any way I can. Also a Resolution of Commendation to the builder – and there are a lot of bad feelings about it – but to the builder that donated the Big Toy for John Glenn Park.

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**Mr. Leech** (continued):

Next Council – my friend Petro, and Norton – do the right thing. Do the right thing – together without any pettiness. The pettiness has got to stop. And be the best you can be.

Remember to pray for my successful surgery this Friday. God Bless – Councilman Bob. Thank you.

**Council President Ernst** thanked Mr. Leech for his comments.

I'd like to add one thing. I'd like to invite everyone on the dais to Ruby Tuesday's for a soda pop after this meeting – on me.

**Mr. Trafis**:

Boy, Leech, I don't know where to start – you gave me so many openings here.

You know there has always been a little competition, I think, between Leech and Petro on who is the longest-serving Councilman. Frank is doing two more years, and I think if Leech would have gotten another week in he would have beaten Petro.

**Mr. Leech** said, “No, not quite. I have 24, and he has 21.”

I wish you the best in your surgery. It's ironic that it's on November 13<sup>th</sup>, because that is actually my birthday – November 13<sup>th</sup> – and I was born on Friday, the 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Mrs. Lecznar** added, “That explains a lot.”

Well, Caryl, you're going to love this one. My father was born on a Friday, the 13<sup>th</sup>, as well.

**Mr. Leech** asked, “Was that 1880?”

I don't think I was born when you were already on Council. Seriously, though, best of luck. Thank you for filling in as Ward 1 Councilman. I appreciate you, and I wish you all the best.

Now I do have a number of things. First of all, Wednesday is Veterans Day – so thank you to the veterans out there in Seven Hills. There are a lot of them. We wouldn't be here today without you.

Jack Moga – I was contacted by a resident on Mapleview today who was up at this meeting, I'd say two to four weeks ago, about a culvert pipe that, I believe, the Mayor directed you to install.

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**Mr. Trafis** (continued):

They said that nothing has happened. They've called and left messages for you, and they have gotten no response. Is there an update that I can give the residents on that?

**Mr. Moga** replied, "Sure. No one called me. But we cut the apron out to install the driveway pipe. I had to get some catch basins done off Shelley Drive that actually somebody emailed to you. We got that done. The pipe is going to get done – it should be the next couple of weeks. It wasn't that we didn't want to do it. I don't understand how she contacted me, when she didn't contact me. We're going to get it done in the next couple of weeks."

Okay -- well, I'll let her know you think she's lying. So, okay, thanks for getting there.

**Mr. Moga** said, "No, that's not what I'm saying."

That's what you're saying, Jack, but thanks.

**Mr. Moga** replied, "Well, let me tell you something. You can do whatever you want to do, Matt. I'll be glad to take care of that. We had some catch basins that we had to do. And also we're going to take care of the one on Edgewood, too, that you wanted us to take care of."

I appreciate that. Thank you.

**Mr. Moga** said, "Well, not a problem, Matt. Okay, good job."

You, too. On another note. Congratulations to the new incoming Council members – Tony Biasiotta, Jim Kukral, Frank Petro, and Tom Kraynak. I'm very much looking forward to working with each and every one of you. I think there's a lot of good things we can do for Seven Hills.

I also want to congratulate Tom Jaros for stepping up and running a campaign. You're a very outspoken individual. You stand up for what you believe in, and I'm glad somebody stepped up. So, thanks Tom.

As most, if not all, of the residents are aware of, we campaigned on what we called The Contract for Seven Hills. What you witnessed tonight is precisely why we assembled a team of candidates that have a new vision for Seven Hills. I'm going to read just a couple of points that was really our hallmark of our campaign, and this was part of the redirecting, rebranding, and reorganizing the City part of the contract. As everybody knows we identified the past and status quo and one of them was rubber stamp. And it said over the last decade of leadership previous Mayors, along with previous Council Presidents, have positioned and controlled the majority of City Council as a rubber stamp to their agenda.

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**Mr. Trafis** (continued):

The basic premise of checks and balances has been nearly non-existent. And one thing that we have been working on, and will start working on when the new Council takes over, is the point with the City's future column in our Contract with Seven Hills that says we will work on the nearly non-existent City hiring practices and will insist on standards, guidelines, transparency, and accountability. We will promote and encourage the Administration to operate the City on a best practices philosophy.

This goes hand in hand with what we saw with one appointment tonight and the attempt of another appointment tonight. Things like this absolutely need to stop in Seven Hills. Political posturing needs to end. Sneaking behind closed doors and talking to people and springing appointments on City Council on the dais needs to end. We have a team that has come together, is united on changing the direction of Seven Hills, and I fully anticipate and expect that this team will uphold the points in the Contract for Seven Hills that we promised our residents. And, frankly, we were given a mandate by our residents to do exactly what we said.

So, to the residents in the audience and the residents listening to the audio of this meeting, thank you for your trust in us. And with a united team on City Council you're going to see great things happen in Seven Hills. Thank you.

*Mr. Trafis' comments drew some applause from members of the audience.*

**Mrs. Lecznar**:

I do want to wish the Veterans that we have in our City a Happy Veterans Day. If it wasn't for you fighting for our country and giving your lives and the lives of your colleagues, we wouldn't be where we are today.

I also want to wish Bob good luck with his surgery. This is probably one of the only times that Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> will be good luck for you. Best wishes.

**Mr. Barth**:

I would like to congratulate all the winners from last Tuesday's election. I thank those that ran but were defeated for their efforts, because competition and choice is good for the City.

A special thank you to the incumbents that lost. I thank you for dedicating your time and efforts, not only to the campaign but for your years of public service to Seven Hills, because God knows that none of us do this for the money.

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**Mr. Barth** (continued):

What was intriguing to me was that new and energetic candidates surfaced this year – Tony Biasiotta and Jim Kukral – who were successful in their efforts – and Mike Wallace and John Frank who ran great campaigns, but lost.

Now that the election is behind us, I look forward to working with the Mayor and the new leadership team on Council to move this City forward.

Bob, you don't have to ask me to keep you in my prayers – you are already in my prayers – you have been for the last week. And I'll be thinking of you and praying for you on Friday. You'll be fine – you'll be back here. You'll be back on the Parks Committee, I'm sure, right after the first of the year. God Bless you.

**Council President Ernst:**

Bob, I'd like to wish you the best of luck. I will be thinking about you on Friday.
